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"And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment:" (Heb. 9:27). Who is it that "appointed men once to die"? It was not a human judge nor the devil. It was God, the sovereign Judge of all, Who made this appointment that no person can avoid. And why did God make this appointment? It was because of our sins, "for the wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23). God is a just God, and He must punish sin with death upon all persons to whom sin is imputed (charged). His justice demands this! Is there any hope for sinners like us? YES! "So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for Him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation" (Heb. 9:28). The only hope for sinners is that God's Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, stand as their Surety, having their sin-debt charged to Him, and as their Substitute to redeem them by His obedience unto death. He bore "the sins of MANY," and who are the "many"? They are His sheep, the elect of God, given to Christ before the world began (2) Tim. 1:9-10). And how do we identify the "many"? They are all brought by God to believe and rest in Christ for all salvation!
